## Jurgenson claims World Senior Curling title

BC's Christine Jurgenson, Cheryl Noble, Pat Sanders and Roselyn Craig (alternate – Lena West) won their second World Senior Women's Curling Championship this past weekend.

The foursome went undefeated through the 11 team round-robin, and scored 2 points in the last end of the semi-final to defeat Switzerland 6-5 and advance to Saturday's final. Canada faced Sweden in the gold-medal game and opened strong with 3 points in the first end, followed by a blank in the second and steal of 4 in the third. Sweden came back with singles in the fourth and fifth ends, but Canada put the game to rest scoring 2 in the 6th for a 9-2 final.

## Silver & Gold for BC Masters

Manitoba and British Columbia teams split the major honours in the 2011 Canadian Master Curling Championships in Winnipeg.

Joyce McDougall's team from Brandon completed an unbeaten run to the national women's title, topping the Karin Host team from BC 11-5 in the final. Host settled for the silver medal, while the Suzanne Green foursome from Nova Scotia won bronze.

The men's championship went to Kelowna's Garry Gelowitz team, a 6-3 winner over Manitoba's John Usackis in the final. Gelowitz was backed up by Rob Koffski, Brad Cmolik, and Dennis Case on the way to the third Master Men's title for BC. Usackis earned the silver medal as the national runner-up, while Ontario's Layne Noble won the bronze.

## The Dominion Curling Club Championship - British Columbia

This is the third year of The Dominion Curling Club Championship although in British Columbia many of our club curlers also recognize it as the BC Club Challenge and the Pacific International Cup. This phenomenal series of events is designed to provide the average club curler with the opportunity to become a national champion. You have seen the Canadian Curling Association ads on TV where a club curler becomes a star if only for a moment; well, The Dominion Curling Club Championship allows one men's and one women's club curling team from British Columbia to become provincial champions and wear our colours at the largest national curling championship in the world.



It all starts with 49 curling clubs around the province running club championships or playoffs and having 39 women's teams and 47 men's teams advance to regional BC Club Challenge events. While 19 of the 21 clubs participated in the Mainland Club Challenge with a total of 35 teams, the Island South Club Challenge holds the 100% participation records with all eight eligible clubs sending men's and women's champions to compete.

The regional events were hosted by six curling centres contributing their ice time and facilities and organizing banquets and draws to determine regional champions. Special thanks to Fred Thompson (Nelson), Brian Schreiner (Enderby), Ron Phillips and Geoff Magrath (Prince George), Mare Michell (Comox Valley), Lorraine Gagnon (Kerry Park) and Jim Mann (Richmond) for coordinating the six regional events, where our club teams get the opportunity to showcase their talents against the club champions of the other curling centres in the region. From these six events, eight men's and eight women's teams advanced to The Pacific International Cup and The Dominion Curling Club Championship of British Columbia where they played seven round robin games with the top two from each pool advancing to the championship round. This event, now in its 12th year, included eight men's and eight women's teams from the Yukon, North West Territories and various American States (Alaska, Washington, Oregon, California, Arizona and Colorado) to give BC teams the opportunity to compete internationally on their quest to become champions. The curlers unanimously raved about their treatment at this event and the curling memories of a lifetime that were created thanks to an incredible group of volunteers, superb ice conditions and banquet facilities at the Richmond Curling Centre. This volunteer team has been together for twelve years with a core committee of Jim Schuman, Wayne Braun, Jim Mann, Elaine Spacey, Howie Larke, Bev Oldham and Doug Bradley.

After multiple tie-breaker games, the final four men's and women's championship round teams were declared – the women from Richmond, Kerry Park, Cowichan Lake and Comox Valley, and the men from Golden Ears, Washington, Vancouver and Ashcroft. Our women's champions representing the North Island Club Challenge and Comox Valley are Deb Goodwin, Lonnie Schopp, Kim Jonsson and Lori Ross. The men's champions, in what has been declared the biggest moment in Ashcroft curling history,

representing the Okanagan Club Challenge and Ashcroft are Dwight Hodder, Paul Quesnel, Gary Farr and Cheyne Hodder (with injured Chris Brezina cheering on the sidelines). These new provincial champions will compete on behalf of all club curlers in British Columbia at The Dominion Curling Club Championship in Richmond this November, where men's and women's teams from all 14 Canadian curling associations will fly their colors and try and gain a national title.

Not only did 86 club teams from 49 curling clubs in British Columbia have an incredible opportunity, but the Richmond Curling Centre, the six regional Club Challenge events and The Pacific International Cup/The Dominion Curling Club Championship of British Columbia were pleased to present a cheque to the BC Paraplegic Association (BCPA), the official charity of The Dominion Curling Club Championship of British Columbia, for a cheque in the amount of \$9,500. This celebration of club curling and club curlers providing memories of a lifetime also demonstrates the generosity of the curling community in supporting the BCPA active around the province for people with spinal cord injuries.

Please support your regional club challenge events next year. As both Ashcroft and Comox Valley have learned, every curling centre in the province has the capability to fly a provincial championship banner!

## 2011 Region 11 Men's Tour Championship

The Steve Wright team from the Royal City CC has won the third annual Region 11 Men's Bonspiel Tour Championship, defeating Chilliwack's Russ Knutson 6-1 in seven ends last Sunday in Langley. It was a rematch for the two teams, who met earlier in the A event final of their pool with Knutson coming out on top.

Wright never gave Knutson a good scoring opportunity in the championship final. He drew on last rock for two points in the first end then stole two more in the second end when Knutson hit the wrong side of a rock on his last-rock takeout. Knutson's single point came in the third end when he had to draw for one against three Wright counters.



Down 5-1 after four ends, Knutson gambled in the fifth when he tried a difficult run back around a guard for two points rather than play a tap back on the rock for one. The run-back attempt missed, giving Wright a steal of one and a 6-1 lead. Knutson surrendered before throwing his last rock in the seventh end when all he had left was a draw for one.

Sixteen teams qualified for the Tour Championship, based on Tour points earned in bonspiels this season. They were placed into two pools of eight teams with two teams qualifying from each pool in a double-knockout draw. Knutson and Wright qualified through the A pool while Darren Frycz of Royal City CC and Richard Brower from the Langley club qualified in the B pool. In the semi-finals, Knutson easily defeated Brower and Wright won a closer match over Frycz.

The Tour Championship benefited greatly this year with the sponsorship of Action Athletic Wear that provided prizes for the qualifying teams. Thanks go to Bob Boyer for agreeing to be a sponsor. ## Last rock to be delivered at historic Vancouver Curling Club building

The last stone will be delivered at the 62-year-old Vancouver Curling Club (VCC) building on Saturday April 30 – before the Club moves into the Vancouver 2010 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games legacy facility in fall 2011.

The VCC has been in its current building since 1949. Since Vancouver was awarded the 2010 Winter Games back in 2003, the Club has worked closely with the Vancouver Park Board on plans to create a new era of curling in the building that hosted the Olympic and Paralympic curling events last year. The Last Rock Ceremony marks the Club's six-decade history in its present location.



“For the last time, a stone will glide across the ice in a building that has created many memories over the last 62 years,” said VCC President Jen Lucas. “While we celebrate the past, we are now looking forward to creating a wealth of memories in our new state-of-the-art home.”

There will be more opportunities for curling at all levels when the VCC moves into the recreation centre at Hillcrest Park. The new facility will have eight sheets – an increase from the current five sheets.

“With more sheets, we will be able to offer a range of programming from rentals, to novice leagues, to competitive leagues to meet the increased interest in curling as a result of the 2010 Winter Games,” said VCC Manager Chris Daw.

## Canadian Curling Association announces nominated curlers and coach for 2012 Winter Youth Olympic Games

The Canadian Curling Association (CCA) has announced the four curlers and coach who will be nominated to the Canadian Olympic Committee for participation in the inaugural Winter Youth Olympic Games in Innsbruck, Austria, January 13-22, 2012.

Emily Gray of O'Leary, Prince Edward Island; **Corryn Brown of Kamloops, British Columbia**, Derek Oryniak of Winnipeg, Manitoba and Thomas Scoffin of Whitehorse, Yukon have been selected by the CCA, while the coach and team leader will be Helen Radford of Halifax, Nova Scotia.

The selection of the athletes was a comprehensive process combining on-ice performance at the 2011 Canada Winter Games in Halifax and a formal application process, which included a written essay, academic excellence, involvement in their communities and interest in other athletic and cultural activities.

"The Canadian Curling Association is very pleased to have completed our formal selection process for the first ever Winter Youth Olympic Games," explained the CCA's Chief Executive Officer, Greg Stremlaw. "This event will offer an incredible opportunity to these four young athletes to represent Canada not only on the ice, but also as ambassadors of Canada and the sport of curling. This will be an experience that these athletes will remember for the rest of their lives."

Sixteen countries will participate in the curling competition. Each country will be represented by two junior men and two junior women, who were born between January 1, 1994 and December 31, 1995.

Two types of curling competitions will take place at Innsbruck Exhibition Centre. The first will be a regular Mixed event with two pools of eight teams, leading to the playoffs and medal round. The second will feature Mixed Doubles with an international flavour. Teams of two curlers will be chosen, based on a formula involving results from the regular mixed event. However, players from the same country will not play together.

The Youth Olympic Games aim to bring the Olympic ideals to young people around the world, and, following the success of the first Youth Olympic Games in Singapore in 2010, the stage is now set for the first-ever winter version.

Created by the International Olympic Committee (IOC), the Winter Youth Olympic Games will attract 1,058 athletes competing in seven Olympic Winter Sports (15 disciplines). The seven sports are Bobsleigh, Luge, Skiing, Curling, Biathlon, Ice Hockey and Skating, with the age of the competitors ranging from 14 to 18, depending on the sport.

Curling's Peter Sweetman will join 5 other outstanding volunteers who were selected by their peers to receive the 2011 Sport BC Community Sport Hero Awards in Cranbrook.

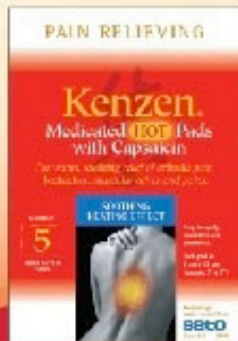
