Curl BC Member Facilities receive \$29,200 in grant funding

Four BC curling centres have received funding from the Canadian Curling Association's Curling Assistance Program totaling \$29,200.

Earlier this season, the Canadian Curling Association announced the renewal of an annual funding program to provide financial assistance to member curling centres across the country. The program targets projects designed to grow the sport of curling at the community level and/or assist capital projects critical to the operation and health of the CCA's membership.

In order to be eligible for these funds, BC curling centres must be affiliated members of Curl BC. The following four BC centres received funding from the program this year:

- Glen Meadows Curling Association: \$6,200
- Nanaimo Curling Centre: \$12,000
- Nelson Curling Club: \$5,000
- Powell River Curling Club: \$6,000

These facilities must now wait a minimum of three years before applying for funds from this program again. The three year waiting period ensures that new centres will receive funding each year.

Over \$1.4 million in funding was requested from across the country this year with \$234,523.86 being granted.

Parksville awarded 2012 Canadian Direct Insurance BC Men's Curling Championship with new championship format

Curl BC is pleased to announce that the 2012 Canadian Direct Insurance BC Men's Curling Championship has been awarded to the Parksville Curling Club. This event will run from February 8-12, 2012.

For the first time in its history, the Championship will follow a 16-team triple knockout with a 4-team page playoff format; a change from previous years' 10-team round-robin with page playoff formats.

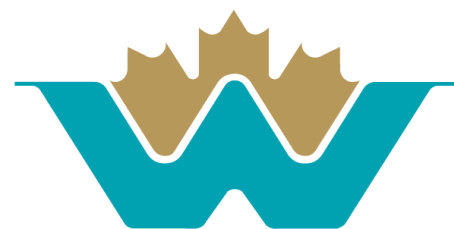
This change comes as a result of an on-going playdown review being conducted by Curl BC to ensure that all respective playdowns meet the needs of the changing face of curling in BC. This change will only apply to the BC Men's playdowns, therefore the 2012 Scotties BC Women's Curling Championship presented by Best Western will remain a 10-team round-round with page playoff format.

The move to a triple-knockout will decrease the length of the Championship by 2 days for both the participating players and the volunteers. Most importantly, an additional six teams will now qualify for the event enabling more players to experience BC's top curling championship, increasing the opportunity for developing teams to qualify and guaranteeing that all games played during the week have significant meaning to both teams.

The top men's teams in BC will battle for the title and a berth into the 2012 Tim Hortons Brier in Saskatoon, SK, March 3-11, 2012. The Canadian Direct Insurance BC Championship semi-final and final games will be televised on Shaw TV & Shaw Direct.

The BC Men's Curling Championship has produced four national championship teams skipped by Frenchy D'Amour (Trail – 1948), Lyall Dagg (Vancouver – 1964), Rick Folk (Kelowna – 1994) and Greg McAulay (Royal City – 2000).

The Parksville Curling Club was first formed in 1991, but did not find a building to call home until 2003, when it signed a lease with the Regional District to take over an old hockey arena. This facility hosted the 2007 BC Master Men's & Women's Curling Championships and the 2009 Scotties Tournament of Hearts BC Women's Curling Championship.

Victoria & Coquitlam to host 2012 & 2013 Tim Hortons BC Junior Curling Championships

Curl BC is pleased to announce that the 2012 Tim Hortons BC Junior Curling Championships have been awarded to the Victoria Curling Club. This event will run from December 27 – 31, 2011.

The top eight junior men's and women's teams in BC will battle for the titles and berths into the M&M Meat Shops Canadian Junior Curling Championships in Napanee, Ontario, February 4-12, 2012. The Tim Hortons BC Championships will begin with full event round-robins followed by three-team playoffs.

The host site for the 2013 Tim Hortons BC Junior Curling Championships has also been awarded. These events will be hosted at the Coquitlam Curling Club. This is the first host site awarded for 2013 and is the beginning of a new hosting strategy put in place by Curl BC. The goal is to have host sites in place a minimum of two years in advance. This strategy will help future host committees by shadowing events held in the previous year, resulting in a more positive event experience for both the volunteers and the competitors. The deadline for 2012/13 host site bid applications is June 1st.

The BC Junior Curling Championships have produced seven national junior championship teams skipped by Jerry Caughlin (Oliver – 1961), Sandra Plut (Kamloops – 1982), Jodi Sutton-Green (Oliver – 1986), Julie Sutton-Skinner (Oliver/Kelowna – 1987), Mike Wood (Victoria – 1988), Dean Joanisse (Esquimalt – 1989) and Brad Kuhn (Kelowna – 2000). Most recently, Dailene Sivertson's Victoria foursome won silver at the 2010 Canadian Junior Women's Curling Championship.

The Victoria Curling Club is an 8 sheet facility and has hosted past events such as the 1994 and 2005 BC Junior Curling Championships and the 1999 Canadian Mixed Championships. Also, the VCC has played a major part in supporting the 1958 & 1984 Brier, 1974 Women's Lassie, as well as the 2005 World Men's Curling Championship and the 2009 Scotties Canadian Women's Curling Championship.

The Coquitlam Curling Club is a 6 sheet facility that was recently renovated in 2009. This club has hosted past events such as the 2007 Senior and 2011 Master regional playdowns.



Grand Forks to host 2012 BC Master Curling Championships

Curl BC is pleased to announce that the 2012 BC Master Curling Championships have been awarded to the Grand Forks Curling Club. These events will run from March 1-4, 2012.

The top eight master men's and women's teams in BC will battle for the titles and berths into the Canadian Master Curling Championships in St-Lambert, Quebec, March 25-31, 2012. The BC Championships will begin with two pools of four, with the top two in each pool advancing to semi-finals.

The BC Master Curling Championships have produced 2 national master championship teams skipped by Rick Pughe from Royal City in 2008 and Garry Gelowitz from Kelowna in 2011. Richmond's Karin Host team has recently won two national silver medals in the 2009/10 and 2010/11 seasons.

The Grand Forks Curling Club is a 4 sheet facility and hosted the 2010 BC Master Curling Championships, as well as the 2008 BC Senior Men's Curling Championship.

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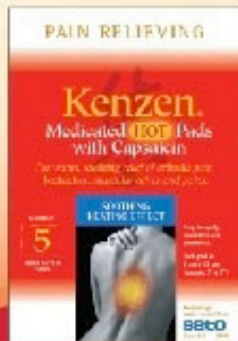

Nanaimo to host the 2012 Williams Moving & Storage BC Mixed Curling Championship

Curl BC is pleased to announce that the 2012 Williams Moving & Storage BC Mixed Curling Championship has been awarded to the Nanaimo Curling Centre. This unique event that enables men and women to play together on the same team will be held March 15 – 18, 2012.

The BC Championship will host the top eight mixed curling teams from across the province in the 2011/2012 season. Teams will compete in a new format for the championship title in the upcoming season, compared to previous years' round-robin, 3-team playoff system. The event will now follow a triple knock-out format with a 4-team page-playoff. The new format will allow the event to be held in a fewer number of days, allow an additional team to advance to playoffs, and is hoped to increase participation numbers in the regional qualifying events.

The BC Mixed Curling Championship first began in 1964 and was won by the Gil Moel rink from the Trail Curling Club. This event has hosted many of BC's and Canada's top curlers throughout its history. 1988 Olympic Gold Medalist, Lindsay Sparkes, 2000 World Men's Champion, Bryan Miki, 2000 World Junior Men's Champion, Brad Kuhn, 2002 Olympic Bronze Medalists, Georgina Wheatcroft and Diane Dezura, 2009 World Senior Champions, Pat Sanders & Roselyn Craig and 2010 Paralympic Gold Medalist, Jim Armstrong are just a few of the event's past winners.



The Nanaimo Curling Centre has hosted previous events such as the 2004 BC Men's Curling Championship, 2008 Canadian Master Curling Championships and the 2010 BC Senior Curling Championships.
