Senior beats BC junior champs in Peace Arch final

That old line about old age and treachery beating youth turned out to be true this past weekend in the final of the Peace Arch men's bonspiel. Senior curler Darrell Zbeetnoff from Peace Arch scored a couple of four-enders against Tyler Klymchuk's reigning BC junior champions from Langley, resulting in the junior squad shaking hands after seven ends, down by six points.

The 19 teams in the bonspiel were divided into pools with six teams qualifying for the prizes after round robin play. Chris Faa from Vancouver CC won the bronze medal game (hey, I couldn't resist!) over Peace Arch's Jack Finnbogason, making a draw against four on his final rock. Faa is now back on top of the Region 11 Men's Bonspiel Tour standings with 1010 points, 16 short of the number set by point standings leader Darren Frycz in last year's inaugural season.

Langley's Bruce Feltham also moved up the points standings, finishing fifth and the Joe Shoemsmith team from Seattle was sixth.

Gibsons event cancelled

The men's bonspiel that was scheduled for this weekend in Gibsons has been cancelled due to a lack of entries, meaning there will be no more events prior to the tour championship, Mar. 26-28 at Golden Ears Winter Club in Maple Ridge.

With the Region 11 Men's Bonspiel Tour now complete, teams have until **Monday, Mar. 15** to register as a tour team and/or declare their interest to compete in the tour championship, Mar. 26-28 at Golden Ears.

The top 16 registered teams in the points standings are eligible with invitations extended to the next teams down the standings if any of the top 16 decline to participate. At present the cut off line is any registered team with 416 or more points, which is where last year's tour championship winner Clem Degobbi sits in the standings.

The format for the tour championship is two pools of eight teams with double knockouts in both pools, qualifying four teams in total for the playoffs.

Bold teams are registered on the tour and eligible for the tour championship. There is no cost to register a team to be eligible for the tour championship, but your team can have no more than one player who has qualified in men's or senior men's playdowns in the current or previous season.
