Brown wins Canada Winter Games curling gold

Richmond, BC (February 21, 2011) Kamloops' Corryn Brown, Erin Pincott, Samantha Fisher and Sydney Fraser defeated Alberta by a score of 3-1 in Friday's Canada Winter Games gold medal curling game.

Brown finished second in her pool with wins over Northwest Territories (6-2), Saskatchewan (6-5), Manitoba (6-4), New Brunswick (6-4) and a single loss to Nova Scotia (5-4). She defeated Ontario by a score of 4-1 in the semi-final and capped off the week with a low scoring 3-1 decision over Alberta in the final.

Brown and company (all 15 years of age) also won silver at the 2011 Tim Hortons BC Junior Curling Championships (under 21 event) in late December at the North Shore Winter Club.

Daniel Wenzek and his Victoria team will compete in the boys' competition this week.

In other curling action this weekend, the field has been set for the 2011 Williams Moving & Storage BC Mixed Curling Championship in Prince Rupert, March 15-20. The competing teams are:
