Craig, Fewster, Lewis & Winters earn provincial berths

Richmond, BC (December 6, 2010) Four more teams have now been added to the playing field of the 2011 Scotties BC Women's Curling Championship presented by Best Western. The first two of four qualifying events for the women's championship were held this weekend in Langley and Summerland curling centres.

The Jen Fewster rink (Prince George) of Kristen Fewster, Blaine Richards and Amber Cheveldave won three straight games to earn the A-event berth of the Scotties Interior Women's Curling Playoff #1, while Kristy Lewis (Richmond) and her teammates of Marilou Richter, Michelle Ramsay and Sandra Comadina defeated Nanaimo's Nicole Backe 7-5 in the coastal A-event final.

Nelson's Jill Winters, Samantha Almquist, Natalie Nowicki and Heather Nichol defeated Karla Thompson (Kamloops) 7-6 in a B-event winner versus C-event winner playoff. Meanwhile, the Roselyn Craig rink (Duncan) of Sarah Wark (skip's stones), Michelle Allen and Megan Reid, defeated the Backe squad in both B & C-event finals to grab their ticket to Cloverdale January 17-23, 2011.

The remaining four teams will be declared in the Scotties Coastal (Comox) and Interior (Williams Lake) Women's Curling Playoffs #2, December 17-19.
