Host wins silver at Canadian Masters' Curling Championship

Richmond, BC (April 6, 2010) – Richmond's Karin Host rink of Lorraine Warn, Dianne Tasaka and Betty Dharmasetia did BC proud this past week capturing a silver medal at the 2010 Canadian Masters' Curling Championship in Saint John, N.B.

The BC squad finished on top of their pool with a perfect 5-0 record earning themselves a spot in the 1 vs. 2 game. They lost that game 11-4 to Nova Scotia but rebounded with an 8-5 semi-final win against New Brunswick. Although the final game was close, the Nova Scotia team prevailed with a 7-5 victory over BC.

On the men's side, Kelowna's Garry Gelowitz, Roy Giles, Dennis Case and Fred Trussell also made playoffs. They finished in a tie for first place in their pool but were placed in the 3 vs. 4 game as the second seed. Unfortunately, their playoff run was cut short after losing a close 6-5 battle to Ontario, the eventual championship winner.

Vernon's Tyler VanDenBerghe, Chad Kylo, Colby Nowlin and Tyler Young narrowly missed playoffs at the Under 18 Optimist International Curling Championship in Regina. They finished with a 3-2 record missing the playoffs by one win. Kamloops' Corryn Brown, Erin Pincott, Samantha Fisher, Sydney Fraser and Cierra Fisher also had a good showing with a record of 2-3.
