Jurgenson claims World Senior Curling title

Richmond, BC (April 26, 2011) BC's Christine Jurgenson, Cheryl Noble, Pat Sanders and Roselyn Craig (alternate – Lena West) won their second World Senior Women's Curling Championship this past weekend.

The foursome went undefeated through the 11 team round-robin, and scored 2 points in the last end of the semi-final to defeat Switzerland 6-5 and advance to Saturday's final. Canada faced Sweden in the gold-medal game and opened strong with 3 points in the first end, followed by a blank in the second and steal of 4 in the third. Sweden came back with singles in the fourth and fifth ends, but Canada put the game to rest scoring 2 in the 6th for a 9-2 final.

This is BC's eighth world curling championship since 2000.
