Scott captures third BC title

Richmond, BC (January 11, 2010) –Kelowna’s Kelly Scott captured her third BC provincial title yesterday at the Penticton Curling Club. Scott along with Jeanna Schraeder, Sasha Carter, Jacquie Armstrong and Gerry Richard stole their way to victory of the 2010 Scotties BC Women’s Curling Championship presented by Best Western.

Scott beat the Kelley Law rink from the Royal City Curling Club by a score of 8-4 in the championship final. Steals in ends 4, 5 and 9 tallied up to total four points which proved to be the difference for the 2007 World Champion.

Scott won her previous two BC crowns in 2005 and 2006. On the national stage, Scott won Bronze in 2005 and Gold in 2006 and 2007. Scott returned to the provincial scene last season after failing to defend her Team Canada berth into the 2009 National Championship. A disappointing loss at the regional level ended Scott’s 08/09 season quickly.

Jacquie Armstrong at lead was a new edition to the team this year but proved she belonged by leading the player shooting percentages at 83%. Armstrong has attended one National Scotties Tournament of Hearts as a fifth player and been the provincial runner-up three times.

Scott and company now advance to the Scotties Tournament of Hearts in Sault Ste. Marie, Ont. January 30th – February 7th, 2010.
